Activities:

Open Planetarium – The doors will remain open for drop-in visitors, and a science educator will explain the current sky.

Sensory Garden – The Sensory Garden – designed by Pal-O-Mine Equestrian's J-STEP Program and Gro Girl Horticultural Therapy – is located at the entrance to the Charles and Helen Reichert Planetarium.
